He has also been engaged in discipleship work with men in addiction recovery through Shine the Light Collective in Sparta and previously through Next Chapter La Crosse.

Jason is married to his wife, Amy, who also works in the recovery community at Adult and Teen Challenge of Western Wisconsin,

## WITH FORMER RESIDENTS

I have been blessed to volunteer with the La Crosse jail ministry with Horizon Christian for over 2 years. I remember being so nervous my first time (*and each time if I'm honest*); worrying that I wouldn't have anything authentic or of value to share with the women. Every time I go, the Holy Spirit meets me there and uses me in surprising ways. Every time I go with my team for bible study, I always make sure to emphasize the importance of connection once they have been released. Their old life, friends, addictions, and habits will be right there to overwhelm them the minute they are released. It is so important to find a Bible-teaching church community that will welcome them in, love and disciple them well, and

There have been many people from jail ministry who have come to be a part of the Horizon family. # WHY I SERVE

## LA CROSSE JAIL MINISTRY

A YouTube video about men on death row inspired me to get involved with the La Crosse Jail Ministry. It made me feel sad knowing

that many of these men might not know Jesus, so I reached out to a friend of my grandpa's who introduced me to the ministry.

Now, I meet with residents at the La Crosse Juvenile Detention Center two to three times a month. We get an hour each visit—sometimes we talk about Jesus and the Bible, and other times we just play basketball. A lot of the ministry is simply showing up, being present, and listening. I try to follow the rule of 20% talking and 80% listening, trusting the Holy Spirit to work in the room.

Attendance varies. Some days only one person shows up, other days three, and sometimes as many as ten. We even had one young man fully give his life to Christ after just a few sessions. Moments like that remind me why this work matters. If their hearts don't change, they're likely to reoffend—and true heart change only comes through Jesus Christ.
